

G20 Hamburg 7 – 8 July 2017

General information: security provisions, public transport and more

In light of the G20 Summit taking place on Friday 7 July and Saturday 8 July 2017, Hamburg will be welcoming numerous heads of state and government, delegates and media representatives into the city. Because of the large number of high-ranking attendees, the Summit requires increased security measures. Most provisions are planned around the Hamburg Messe venue and the Elbphilharmonie concert hall. Demonstrations taking place before and during the Summit may cause additional obstructions and delays.

Security Zones

The security zones around **Hamburg Messe** will be in effect from Wednesday 5 July early in the morning to Saturday 8 July late in the evening. The security zones around the **Elbphilharmonie** will be in effect on Friday 7 July from early in the morning up to late in the evening. **Parked vehicles and bicycles should be removed from the security zones in good time beforehand.**

Security Zones 1 cannot be accessed by unauthorised persons.

Security Zones 2 span a wider area around the Hamburg Messe and Elbphilharmonie venues. The bordering roads are closed off to motorised vehicles and bicycle traffic. Pedestrians may use the sidewalks.

Residents and employees, their guests, as well as delivery, postal and care services who need to enter Security Zones 2 may use several entry points. To enter the zones, it is advised to carry:

- Identification (e.g. passport or ID card) Children are exempted.
- Statement of residence (e.g. Meldeschein)
- Statement of intent (e.g. delivery order, statement of employment)

Airport

Scheduled flight operations should continue as normal. However, depending on the travel schedules of the Summit attendees, departures and arrivals may be subject to short delays. Because access roads to Hamburg Airport may be blocked for short amounts of time, it is recommended to factor in more time than usual for travelling to and from Hamburg Airport during the G20 Summit.


Public Transport

Buses, U/S trains and ferries should run according to their normal timetables. Temporary delays may occur.


- Messehallen U2 station is operational. Exits *Messe* and *Karolinenstraße* are closed off.
- Sternschanze U3 station is operational. Exit *Messe* is closed off.
- Bus no. 35 runs on an alternative route avoiding Karolinenstraße and St. Petersburger Straße.
- (Friday 7 July) Buses no. 6 and no. 111 run on alternatives routes avoiding HafenCity/Speicherstadt.
- (Friday 7 July) Ferry 72 doesn't stop at the stations Elbphilharmonie and Arningstraße.

Police

During the Summit, you can expect to see more police than usual. The Hamburg police are assisted by other police forces to ensure maximum security.
